MISSION DIARY - PRE-MISSION PREP

Rwamagana for Jesus Mission

AEE Rwanda prepared the city mission in Rwamagana, held from July 10th to 16th, 2022. Included were 14 zones, all with different mission sites. After meeting with local church pastors from different denominations, 364 were trained as preservation facilitators from all 14 zones.

We thank God that many who came for training were reminded of their salvation journey, specifically those who carried God's grace. This reminder helped guide them in the process of nurturing new converts. Converts were expected from all zones, including prison ministries, high schools, tea sessions with local and church leaders, and home-based evangelism.

Following the training, facilitators went home with an assignment of thinking deeply about those people who have done their best to nurture them in their early Christian life.

This encouraged them to pay forward the kindness from those who nurtured them and apply it to the new converts. It was a great moment to remember and pray for those who contributed to their salvation journey.

Pastors and facilitators were filled with joy and ready for the city mission, openly confessing that "winning souls is a highlight of their existence in pastoral ministry". The planning time allowed everyone involved to brainstorm and contribute on how to reach the land of Rwamagana with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.



First Fruits of the Rwamagana Mission

Even before the mission started, pastors and facilitators were encouraged by the unity among church leaders of all denominations. They could see that the Holy Spirit had begun to soften the hearts of men and women in the land as they prayed. There was a sense of excitement within the team, a confidence that God was doing something powerful through the 14 zones of Rwanagana.

MISSION DIARY - DAY 1, 10 JULY, 2022

Prayer and Intercession

In partnership with the church, our teams organised open-air campaigns in five sites, reaching 7,472 people; of those people, 169 souls came to know Christ as their Lord and Saviour. It was notable because the Gospel was shared with new believers and those who had taken a step away from God during the pandemic.

The spirit of disobedience was taken away by hearing the undeserved favour of the Heavenly Father. After the missionary Albert MABASI preached the sermon about the prodigal son's return to his father, a young man's life was instantly changed, and he surrendered his life to Christ.

As the army of the Lord marched across the harvest field in Rwamagana, there was a declaration of the destruction of all powers of darkness that tried to resist the Gospel It was a great moment for the missioners to reconnect post-pandemic. This brought an opening to the community and the church - moments of winning souls.



First Fruits of the Rwamagana Mission

University Christian Union leaders were trained as preservation facilitators. 30 committee leaders were trained and prepared for one-on-one evangelism on the campuses. This training also helped prepare them for the follow-up of new believers.







MISSION DIARY - DAY 2, 11 JULY 22

AEE Local Leaders

"He came to seek and save the Lost" Day 2 of AEE Rwanda saw the teams celebrating the union of Word and Deed. That has been the reason for our existence in this ministry experience. The missioners reached people who live in Rwamagana city and its vicinity with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It was amazing to see the community transformation groups of African Evangelistic Enterprise Rwanda, who reside in Rwamagana become the platform for reaching the community. AEE missioners went to three main sites: Murundi, Musha and Munyigina.



By God's grace, among 776 souls, 97 were convicted by the Holy Spirit to repent of their sins.

The Power of the Gospel

They also prayed for the facilitators that they would be strong and courageous in every way. God delivered in all forms; they could go above and beyond what they

had even dared to hope for.

MISSION DIARY - DAY 3, 12 JULY 22

Reach the lost

On day 3 of the AEE Rwanda in-city mission, AEE missioners engaged in 28 outreaches in different city sites. Collectively, the mission(s) reached more than 11,395 people. Of those reached by the Gospel, 856 responded by repenting their sins and accepting Jesus into their lives.



The masses heard the truth, and the church(s) celebrated as they reflected on the impact AEE Rwanda made in the nation on day three, in the past and in days to come.

The missioners kept records of every person who had accepted Christ so that they could make sure they were part of the follow-up and cared for in a way that helped them to understand that they were not alone and would be helped to grow in their faith.



"I went through life's challenges in my family to the extent of stopping my studies. This made me feel hopeless in life. Because of this kind of life, I decided to engage in drug abuse, leading to addiction. I married during this time in my life, but my marriage was unsuccessful because of my bad behaviour. I ended up in divorce, and I remained hopeless and vulnerable. When the preacher shared his testimony about his journey of salvation, my heart was convicted, and

I knew I needed to repent and be saved and turn to my creator. After hearing the Gospel, I plan to join the local church so I may continue growing in Christ. Proclaimation of the Word

On day 5, out of 23 engagements in the city mission, **12,682 people heard the saving message of Jesus Christ, and 1,425 souls came to faith**. People from all sites were hungry for the Gospel, and it was amazing how they were focused as the Word of God was shared.

After preaching, the pastor invited those who wanted to give their life to Jesus. Among those who responded were children. What shocked him was that some pastors and deacons tried to stop the children from coming forward. Seeing this, he had to raise his voice and tell them to let the children come to receive Jesus. It was difficult as some pastors insisted that it was not for children. The pastor was also shocked that while recording those who gave their life to Jesus, they had not recorded the children's names. "We still have not got Jesus' heart for children, and we need to know that they can believe and follow Jesus and be his disciples."

From 10- 17 July, we enjoyed the evangelistic movement in the city by conducting open-air missions in all 14 sectors of Rwamagana district. I was privileged to coordinate the mission in one zone. In the open-air outreaches, we registered 432 souls of people who got saved. Before the mission, we trained 34 preservation facilitators, and all these facilitators are mature believers in Christ who have a passion for evangelism and nurturing new believers in Christ. After the mission, we conducted a strategic meeting to follow up with converts. In agreement with the trained preservation facilitators, we followed up, starting with the neighbouring new converts. Every facilitator has the task of visiting these new babies in Christ and showing love and kindness to them. It is easy for us because we have all the names of the new converts. Finally, with great appreciation, we thank AEE Rwanda for financially supporting us and awakening us to evangelise our community with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We want to see the continuity of this missional partnership that will help us fulfil the task we exist for. Amen!"



The Rwamagana for Jesus Mission saw 62,901 people reached across the entire mission. The number of people who got saved was 4,943.

We are still rejoicing and joining heaven to celebrate the repentance of many sinners who believed in the Gospel.
